

Sample list of items to consider for Walleye and Northern Tackle Box:

Jigs: (Minimum numbers since you will lose them in heavier timber environments)

10 – 1/4 oz. Chartreuse	10 – 3/8 oz. Chartreuse
10 – 1/4 oz. Orange	10 – 3/8 oz. Orange
10 – 1/4 oz. White	10 – 3/8 oz. White

Also consider the use of slip sinkers/bobbers for "bottom bouncing" technique.

Plastic Bodies and Trailers:

50 – 3" grub Chartreuse	50 – 3" shad Chartreuse
50 – 3" grub Black	50 – 3" shad Silver/Black
50 – 3" grub White	50 – 3" shad White

Spoons:

2 - 1/4 oz. Red/White Daredevils	2 – 1/4 oz. Five of Diamonds
2 - 1/4 oz. Johnson's Silver Minnows	2 – 5/8 oz. Doctor Spoons
2 - 1/4 oz. Mepps Timble Doodle or Northland JawBreaker Spoons in assorted colors (at least one FireTiger)	

Spinners and Bucktails:

- 2 – #2 Mepps Bucktails (Gold or Silver Blades)
- 2 – #5 Mepps Bucktails (Gold or Silver Blades)
- 2 – Large Musky style in line spinners in bright fluorescent colors
- 4 – Large Spinnerbaits in natural colors (Walleye or Perch; Northland Bionic Bucktail is a good choice)
- 2 – Hildebrandt Titanium Flex-Tec
- 4 – Buzz baits in white or fluorescent colors

Crank Baits:

- Shad Raps SR8 & SR9 in firetiger, black/gold, blue/silver
- Husky Jerk Y 2 oz. In firetiger, black/gold, blue/silver, perch
- Jointed Rapalas J-11 & J-13 in firetiger, clown, blue/silver, orange/gold
- Rat L Traps 1/2 oz. (floaters and sinkers) in firetiger, blue/silver
- Thunderstick 3/8 oz. in firetiger, green glow in the dark

Terminal Tackle: The most overlooked aspect of the tackle box.

- 25 snap swivels
- 12 12" wire leaders
- 25 #10 barrel swivel (tie 2 feet ahead of your jig to eliminate line twists)
